

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PUBLIC SPEAKING OR SINGING WI'PHIN CERITAIN BOUNDARIES.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Common Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to address any assemblage, meeting or gathering of persons or hold or conduct any public meeting or make or deliver any public speech, lecture or discourse or sing any song br songs or take part in any pubilc debate or discussion in or upon any public street or alley within that certain district in the City of San Diego, which is bounded as follows: On the north by the north side of $C$ street, on the east by the east side of Sixth Street, on the south by the south side of $F$ Street and on the west by the west side of Fourth Street, which district shall be known as the Central Congested District of said city.

Section 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than lwenty-five Dollers nor more than One Hundred Dollars or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding thirty days, or by both such fine and irrprisonment.

Section 3. This is an ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and one of emergenoy, and shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.
